# Why truck tire blowouts are so dangerous

A tire blowout on a heavy commercial truck creates an immediate and violent loss of control. The vehicle's weight shifts suddenly, and a driver may swerve, overcorrect, or jackknife across multiple lanes. The danger is magnified on Alabama's major interstates, where high speeds and dense traffic give other drivers little time to react.

The hot Gulf Coast climate also plays a role. Prolonged exposure to heat and friction can cause tires to deteriorate more quickly. Combined with long-distance hauls and heavy cargo, these conditions increase the likelihood of tire failure.

The consequences are often catastrophic. Victims may face permanent injuries, extensive medical treatment, or the loss of a loved one. Determining whether the blowout was caused by negligence or a manufacturing defect becomes critical in securing fair compensation.

#### Common causes of tire blowouts on Alabama roads

#### Who is liable when a tire blowout causes a truck accident?

- **Trucking companies:** Required to maintain vehicles, inspect tires regularly, and replace unsafe equipment.
